6. Mr. Maxfield Environment Sculpture < June 29th to July 3rd >

Students will learn about the concept of environmental sculpture. We will brainstorm different ways to create outdoor sculpture using natural materials and we will visit local parks to install our own sculpture pieces. Environmental sculpture usually creates or alters the natural environment for the viewer. It introduces physical items into the outdoor environment that are not usually there and surprise the people who see them. To create environmental sculpture, a person plans a piece from the very beginning in relationship to its surroundings. The idea is to combine natural materials together to create a unique object not usually part of the area. Nature art is not hard to do. It can be as simple as organizing some small rocks or pinecones. If it interests you give it a shot!

8. Mt. Fuji Program < July 6th - July 10th > ** For TYIS Students Only **

This is a five day program including a field trip to Mt. Fuji. On the first day, students will have an orientation session at school, to prepare for the field trip. On the second and the third day, they will travel to Mt. Fuji. It will be an overnight program. All students will climb up to the 8th station and stay over at a mountain hut. On the third day, one group will try to climb up to the top, and another group will enjoy the hiking course, instead of going to the top. For the last day, students will gather at school and practice for the final presentation which will be held on Friday.

Basic Schedule for 5 days

Day 1: 9:00am-3:00pm at TYIS: Students learn some basic knowledge of Mt. Fuji and safety issues.

Day 2: Early in the morning, students gather at Shinjuku Station and travel to Mt. Fuji by highway bus. They will climb up to the 7th station and stay over at a mountain hut.

Day 3: Group will try to climb up to the 8th station.

Day 4: Group will try to climb up to the top, and will go down the mountain and come back to Tokyo by highway bus in the late afternoon.

Day 5: 9:00am-3:00pm at TYIS: students will practice for the presentation which will be held from 2:00-3:00pm.
